

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Separate sealed bids will be received by the City of Huron, at the office of the City Manager, City Hall, 417 Main Street, Huron, Ohio 44839 on the 2nd day of March, 2012 until 2:00 pm current local time for the

“Water Treatment Plant Improvements Filter Rehabilitation”

and will be publicly opened and read immediately thereafter. Each bid must contain the full names of the party or parties making the same, with an affidavit as to interested parties, and in the case of a corporation not chartered in Ohio, with a proper certificate that such corporation is authorized to do business in Ohio, and shall be accompanied by a Bid Guaranty Bond for the full amount (100%) of the Bid, in favor of the City of Huron, Ohio or a certified check, cashier’s check, or surety bond in the amount of 5% of the Bid, payable to the City of Huron, Ohio.

It is agreed that the bid guaranty shall be for the benefit of the City pursuant to Section 153.54 of the Ohio Revised Code if the undersigned fails to execute the Contract in conformity with the Form of Contract incorporated in the contract documents and furnish Bond and insurance certificates within ten (10) days after the notification of the award of the Contract to the undersigned.

The work covered by the Contract Documents includes the following:

Filter Rehabilitation:

This project consists of the demolition and subsequent rehabilitation of five filters at the City of Huron Water Treatment Plant. Work items include removing and disposing of the filter media consisting of anthracite, sand, and support gravel; removing and disposing of existing sub-surface wash agitators and associated piping and fittings; clean existing Wheeler bottom underdrain system; pressure wash existing washwater troughs; provide and install new filter media consisting of support gravel, sand and anthracite; provide and install new surface wash agitators; and all other necessary and appertaining work specified in the contract documents that is needed to construct the filter improvements complete.

The estimated construction cost is \$230,000 as of February 6th, 2012.

BIDDERS must comply with the prevailing wage rates on Public Improvements in Erie County, Ohio, as determined by the Bureau of Wage and Hour, Division of Labor and Worker Safety, Department of Commerce of the State of Ohio.

Attention to the BIDDERS is called to the Instructions to Bidders, which are included in the proposed Contract Documents. Successful BIDDER shall be required to comply with all laws pertaining to minimum wage and discrimination of persons.

A nonmandatory prebid conference will be held for prospective BIDDERS on February 16th, 2012, at 10:00 a.m. at the City of Huron Water Treatment Plant located at 500 Cleveland Road West/Waterworks Drive, Huron, OH 44839.

All bids must be signed and submitted on the blanks provided in the Bid book. Each bidder must submit evidence of its experiences on projects of similar size and complexity. All contractors and subcontractors involved with the project will, to the extent practicable use Ohio Products, materials, services, and labor in the implementation of their project. Additionally, contractor compliance with the equal employment opportunity requirements of Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 123, the Governor's Executive Order of 1972, and Governor's Executive Order 84-9 shall be required.

The City of Huron reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any informalities in the bids received, and to accept any bid which it deems most favorable.
